- 4. Is provocative, balances realistic expectations with vision;
- 5. Is innovative, breaks new ground in bettering the planning process; and
- 6. Is sufficiently completed to evaluate whether the desired results have been realized.

In addition to receiving recognition at MPC's 2005 Annual Meeting, on October 26, featuring Chicago Mayor Richard M. Daley as the keynote speaker, the winner will receive a \$5,000 cash prize.

Submission Guidelines:

- Please provide a brief (25 word) project description and a written response to the above six points in three 8.5" x 11" pages or less. The sixth point is given particular importance, which tends to favor older, more implemented plans.
- Additional supporting material describing the project in greater detail, such as maps, color plans, videos, etc, may be provided (15 copies) and will be made available to the selection committee.
- All submissions become the property of the Metropolitan Planning Council and cannot be returned.
