

United States Manufacturing Goal


"Over the next five years, we are going to double our exports of goods and services."

Chicago Strategy

2010 manufacturing output for the Chicago region was \$52.7 billion, 3% of total US manufacturing output.

Goal of CSI

Sustainable Industry Definition

- Aligns with the City's indigenous assets (existing industrial base, workforce, real estate, infrastructure, water)
- Exports goods or services, or is crucial to the support of those base industries
- Creates well-paying jobs
- Produces products or services that improve the environment, operate in a manner sensitive to the environment, or both

Manufacturers Survey

In general, all respondents rated utility services to be of good or excellent quality in Chicago – water services received the highest average rating, followed by gas, electric, phone, and broadband.

There are location-specific problems with services.

Results were similar for transportation options, although 15% of respondents rated streets and highways as "poor."

Manufacturers Survey

88% of respondents have incorporated or have thought of incorporating sustainable environmental practices or products in their operations.


