
MWRD & Stormwater Management



- TARP (Deep Tunnel System)
- 2004 State Legislation
 - Watershed Plans and Planning Councils
 - Stormwater Partnership Program
 - Stormwater Master Planning
 - Small Streams Maintenance Program
 - Flood-prone Property Acquisition
 - Green Infrastructure/Space to Grow
- Watershed Management Ordinance (WMO)




Cook County Precipitation





- WMO Section 208 Pilot Study
 - Stormwater detention and volume control trading program
 - Watershed release rate impacts on disproportionately impacted communities
- Stormwater Credit Trading Examples
 - Washington D.C.
 - Grand Rapids, MI
- Blue to Green could be the next evolution of stormwater trading at MWRD and help the agency lead the nation in stormwater management innovation





Blue to Green (B2G) Overview



- **1.** Development proposed without adequate stormwater detention space on property.
- 2. To obtain Watershed Management Ordinance (WMO Permit) developer must buy stormwater credits.
- **3.** MWRD uses its property <u>selling</u> stormwater credits.





Why is B2G needed?

- MWRD is the second largest public landowner in Cook County, yet many current leases are not consistent with the MWRD's mission to manage stormwater, for example impermeable parking lot leases
- A significant portion of MWRD leases are in Disproportionately Impacted Areas (DIAs)
- While many leases do not conform with the MWRD's mission, the leases generate revenue that is critical to the agency



What are B2G benefits?

- Consistency between the MWRD actions and its mission
 - More shoreline area as green space, not grey space
 - Revenue from compatible, not incompatible, uses
- Assistance to DIAs via directed revenue stream and increased green space with co-benefits





Next Steps



- Gather feedback
- Amend WMO Section 208 Pilot
 - The pilot is scheduled to be completed in 2025, it would be beneficial to guide the process to drive specific outcomes.
- Build demand
- Ultimately, several ordinances, plans, and laws (WMO, CCSMP, and the MWRD Act) will need to be amended in order to fully implement a credit trading system, including B2G.
