

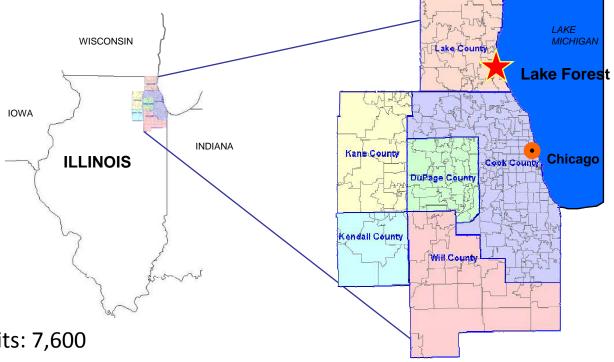

### **Lake Forest Demographics**



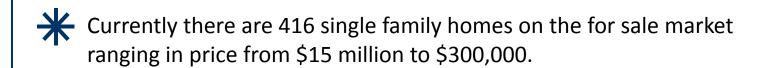
Population: 21,600

# Local Workforce Housing Market Realities Lake Forest, Highland Park, Highwood, Northbrook, Deerfield

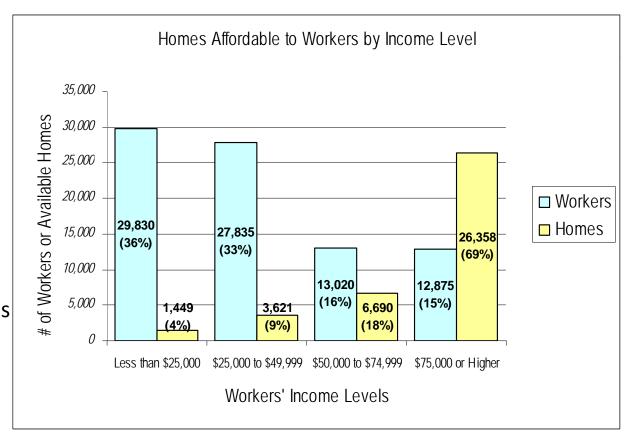
More than two-thirds (69%) of the 5-community area workforce earns less than \$50,000 per year, but only 13% of the local housing stock is affordable to that income level.

### **Affordability Gap**

Many workers in our communities cannot afford to live near work because prices are too high and incomes too low.

#### **Availability Gap**

There is a shortage of homes affordable to the workers in our communities.

- 1 Unit 3 BR/2.5 Bath 1,450 SF @ market rate Rent - \$1,200 per month

### Why Pursue an Interjurisdictional Approach?

- Affordable housing issue don't stop at our borders.
- Allows both communities to leverage staff, experience and resources without reinventing the wheel or duplicating efforts.
- Outside funding/grant opportunities.

#### Partnership Opportunities for LFHT and HPICLT

- HPICLT administer/manage units created thru the LF Inclusionary Housing Ordinance.
- Joint development opportunities in Lake Forest and Highland Park.
- Partnership opportunities to create new units with LF College, LF Hospital.

#### **Next Steps**

- HPICLT considering changes to name, bylaws and geographic services area.
- LFHT and City Council to discuss affordable housing policies in November.
